### **April Leadership Development News**



### 2019 North American Interdistrict Meeting, June 7-9, 2019, Dallas TX

Two items of special interest at the 2019 NAIDM for those involved in Leadership Development.

First, a special "Training Skills for Zonta" 3-hour program on Friday morning, with facilitated opportunities to present, facilitate, give feedback and use group process to demonstrate and reinforce skills for adult learning. Participants will receive a certificate upon completion.

Second, a lunch and share opportunity afternoon for District Leadership Development Coordinators or their

representatives if they are unable to attend.

### **Zonta's 18-Year Commitment to Ending Early Marriage**

Child marriage is any formal marriage or informal union where one or both of the parties are under the age of 18. Each year, 12 million girls are married before the age of 18. That is 23 girls every minute, or nearly 1 every 2 seconds. (girlsnotbrides.org.)

Two survivors of child marriage - one from Canada, Samra Zafar, and one from United States, Fraidy Reiss - will lead us in a strategy session for ending child marriage in North America. Yes, it happens here! And it has the same devastating effect on girls here as in other parts of the world - early end to education, health risks from early childbirth, isolation and disempowerment, and no recognized legal rights as a minor without spousal approval.

Come and learn the facts. Hear women tell their personal stories. Examine the myths and traditions that keep this practice alive. Be part of the solution!

### **Ongoing Professional Development**

You will hear Zonta President Susanne von Bassewitz and meet the Zonta International Board. And you will have the opportunity to choose to attend four of 16 workshops built on the themes of Service and Advocacy, Leadership and Innovation, Media and Partnership, and Membership and Outreach.

# Centennial Anniversary Endowment Campaign

As we approach the 100th anniversary of Zonta International (ZI), members and clubs are encouraged to

contribute to the Zonta International Foundation (ZIF) Centennial Anniversary Endowment Campaign (CAEC). This campaign was initiated to grow the Foundation's long-term investments by the 2020 convention. The endowment

- grows over time ensuring a guarantee that we can maintain and enhance our funding of program goals in the future
- provides a long- term financial base of income, keeping the principal amount intact while dividends and interest can be used, if needed, for ZIF programs and projects in the future
- is separate from the biennial funding for the international service projects and educational programs which are approved at the ZI conventions

Former District 15 Governors Denise Quarles and Carole Calvert Baxter are the CAEC Regional Representatives. They can be contacted for additional information and to make presentations to clubs. Denise and Carole will also be available at the upcoming Area workshops to answer questions and to receive contributions for the endowment fund. Members and clubs are encouraged to consider a onetime gift or recurring gift plan for the endowment campaign.

### **Legacy Gift**

Members can also make a legacy gift to the Zonta International Foundation. Through a planned gift, members can bequest a specific amount, or a percent of their assets, life insurance policy or other financial instruments.

Everyone who informs the ZIF of their provision of this kind of gift will become members of the Mary E Jenkins 1919 Society. Mary was a pioneer. In 1903 she became the president and owner of the Syracuse Herald. Several years later she helped establish one of the nine original Zonta clubs and became the first president of the Confederation of Zonta Clubs.

### **UNITED NATIONS REPORT**

Visit the UN Commission on the Status of Women (CSW63) Zonta Side Event via UNTV

On March 14, 2019, Zonta International hosted a Side Event for the United Nations CSW63 titled "Strengthening Systems and Services That Empower Adolescent Girls to Say no to Child Marriage." It was structured as a panel discussion followed by questions from those present. The panel had a group of amazing women engaged in this issue, including our President, Susanne von Bassewitz, the Minister for the Promotion of Women and Children in Niger, representatives from the UNFPA, UNICEF, Save the Children and the European Union Ambassador. Here are some snippets from the panel discussion:

Mara Marinaki, European Union Ambassador called child marriage a "mass abuse of human rights, not only morally but economically and socially." She spoke about the investment of 260 million Euros in 8 countries in sub-Saharan Africa to address harmful projects to ensure protective legislation, access to quality education and the need to change mentalities.



Nora O'Connell, Save the Children, said that, in spite of laws, 18,000 girls per day are married illegally in the world. While child marriage is going down in Nepal and India, it has become a humanitarian crisis in the refugee

camps.

Madame Zeinabou Adam Elback, Minister from Niger told the group that 1022 marriages were annulled and girls were returned to school last year in Niger. In Niger school is free until age 16 which means girls can stay in school until they are 16 means marriage can be delayed.



Nankali Maksud, Senior Advisor, Harmful Practices, from UNFPA-UNICEF Global Programme to End Child Marriage spoke about the strength of the partnership for the last four years with Zonta International and how 11 countries now have national strategies to end child marriage. The statistics indicated that 76% of girls are married before age 18 in Niger. Delaying marriage will mean fewer children and decreasing risk of gender violence.



Zonta International President Susanne von Bassewitz spoke about why Ending Child Marriage is so important to Zonta. Dr. von Bassewitz indicated that it is a great detractor to positive global development; it inhibits education and prevents young women from reaching their potential.

Members of the local club of Zonta International visited MPP Rick Nicholls's office on April 9, which is recognized as Equal Pay Day in Ontario. While the specific date of Equal Pay Day varies from year to year, it falls in April which means that it takes women fifteen months to earn what men make in twelve. Despite the introduction of the Ontario Pay Equity Act in 1987, women have not achieved equity.



Racialized women, Indigenous women, immigrant and migrant women, women with disabilities, elderly women and women who identify as lesbian, gay, bisexual, trans, and queer (LGBTQ) are especially affect by the inequity.

Discrimination in pay is not limited to one career or demographic. Pay discrimination affects women of all ages, races, and education levels. The Chatham women joined others throughout the province who visited MPP offices to provide information and demand pay equity.


